SPAY NEUTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP)

Spaying or neutering all our animal companions is the only way to prevent surplus births and the misery of homeless animals who often end up losing their lives. It's good for pets, their guardians and the community. Spayed or neutered pets usually enjoy better health and behavior. Guardians save on vet bills and the community saves the high cost of caring for stray animals. And the savings in suffering to cats and dogs is priceless. The good news is, each of us can do our part to bring about this healthy state of affairs. Morning Starr Animal Sanctuary is proud of our SNAP program which was initiated in March of 2005. Since that time we have given out over 238 certificates for the spay/neuter of dogs and cats. Please join us in the effort to stamp out pet overpopulation by making a tax deductible donation towards this cause. You can save lives and tax dollars simply by sponsoring the spay or neuter of at least one animal, your own, a friend's or a feral cat. Please give generously. STATISTICS

As of August 2007, here are the statistics for Morning Starr Animal Sanctuary

Thanks to your continued support....

- We have helped save the lives of 106 dogs. We adopted out 90, 6 are still in foster homes. Some senior dogs have since passed away in their foster homes. All are spay/neutered, micro chipped and have shots.
- We have helped save the lives of 170 cats, adopted out 133. We still have 10 in foster homes. Some are feral (wild) and are now living out their lives in feral colonies, with assistance. Their exact numbers are not registered. All are spay/neutered, shots and leukemia tested negative.
- We have saved the lives of 35 rabbits. We have adopted out 29. All rabbits are spay/ neutered. We have also taken in and adopted out 1 gerbil, 3 guinea pigs and 2 chinchillas.
- We have saved the lives of 7 horses. Because we specialize in senior horses 2 have passed away. We currently have 2 horses in foster homes that we provide daily care for.
- We have saved the lives of 10 goats. We have had pygmy, nubian and boer goats. All were adopted except for 2 pygmy goats, who are 9 years old which are still in our care.
- We have saved the lives of 92 ferrets. We have adopted out 63. Some sick or older ferrets have passed on. We have 26 ferrets in our care at this time.

These are official statistics and do not include the many animals we have assisted into their new forever homes directly from their previous owner.

Duck Soup Recipe

- 1 can ensure, banana or vanilla flavor 1 jar banana baby food
- 1-2 can(s) chicken broth
- 2 cups ferret/kitten food, dry

2 jars chicken with broth baby food ½ cup of Kero Syrup (clear) 4 cups water optional.. Baby Oatmeal, just a little



Directions:


Put the dry ferret/kitten food in a large bowl and cover with 4 cups of water. Let it stand for the whole day and keep adding a little water until the dry food is soft and mushy. Add one can of chicken broth and one can ensure. Use a mixer to blend together. Add all jars of baby food and Kero Syrup. Continue to mix with mixer and add more water or chicken broth until it becomes like a soup. When it is smooth enough you can scoop into ice cube trays and store in the freezer. Pop out one cube per serving and heat in the microwave until melted and warm, not too hot. Add a little water if you need to make it a little more soupy. I add a little dash of baby oatmeal.

For ferrets/kittens who need a little more than just dry food, serve one cube duck soup twice a day. For adrenal ferrets add crushed Melatonin tab, 1 mg.

The is good for sick or elderly ferrets and also for cats who cannot eat hard food any longer. I have also used it for sick kittens.


