For the first time in over 8 years our goat population is down to ZERO. I thought, umm, this would be a good time to try to fix up the goat house. As you can see from the picture of the "old house" many of the goats have had a little taste of it here and there. All the wood would have to be replaced as it was not very water proof any longer due to the wood warping. After a good look at the old shelter I decided it might be better to start over. So now I present to you our new goat house. It is still a work in progress but by the time you get this newsletter I am hoping it would be finished. All the wood, nails, screws and roofing were donated. I provided all the labor and used my saws so there was no expense for the sanctuary.

Wyatt and Peanut Butter

These are two elderly horses. Peanut Butter has cushings and is hard of hearing. He takes special supplements. Wyatt is our oldest guy and has been with us for over 8 years. Both can be sponsored.

Emma

Emma is a very sweet Calf. She arrived here at around 4 days old. She is now almost 9 months old.

Because we take in special needs animals we tend to have these special ones stay with us for their entire lives. Most of them are here because they are not likely to be adopted. We even trade some of our healthy animals with other no kill sanctuaries for their older sick ones. We also house 6 dogs that were deemed unadoptable.

Adoption fees for Rabbits is \$35 ea. All these guys are already spayed and neutered.
