IT TAKES A VILLAGE

Working in rescue, we have asked people to adopt some not so lovable, blind, deaf, untrained, not housebroken, you name the problem they have it, dogs. Many people have stepped up to the challenge in order to give these dogs a second chance. They take on dogs with problems. Some have not been treated well, some have bad habits. As neighbors of these people, we should work together to make sure these dogs are safe. We do not live in the wild west any longer and we must all work together to make sure that our neighbors can have piece of mind that if their dogs do somehow get out, and many will, are safe. If you see that a dog is wearing a special collar, then you know that the owner has had problems with the dog running away. You know the owners have tried to deal with it. If the dog is friendly, then it is our responsibility to help get him home again and not to take its life. I can see no reason to kill a dog other than protecting your own life or that of your family. I believe in the right to protect your life or the life of your animals. When your animals are not in imminent danger, then it is my opinion that you should have no right to take the life of another animal that happens to be on your property. Especially a friendly animal who is hurting no one. You do have a right to shoo them off your property, yell and maybe even throw a rock near them. I am not sure why people are given the right to shoot a dog that happens to show up on their property. I would hope we are past the "wild west" attitude that it means nothing, that it is just a dog. Pets these days are part of families. They sleep on our couches and in our beds. They are best friends for our children and companions for seniors. Please let your neighbors know if you are having a problem with keeping your dogs from getting out. If they know that you are working on it, maybe they will be a little kinder when it happens. There are many options, i.e. invisible fence, electric fence, training etc. Please let's not punish animals if it takes a little while to stop the problem of them getting out. Let's not murder a member of someone else's family. Please talk with your neighbors and tell them that is it not ok to kill your dogs if they go on their property. Digging in a garden or pooping on your lawn is not due the punishment of being shot to death. It is not proper for the neighbors to hear their screams in pain at the hands of a person who is a bad shot. If anything good can come out of this, I would hope it is a lesson for us to help each other to help our neighborhood dogs be safe wherever they go. Dogs naturally try to travel, it is in their nature. Let's show them that humans are kind and loving friends and not senseless murderers. They say it takes a village to raise a child.. Well, sometimes it takes a village to raise a dog too.


