HOW THE SPAY NEUTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP) WORKS WITH YOUR DONATIONS

Some people have been asking how the SNAP works with their donations. On the first of the month Morning Starr Animal Sanctuary puts in \$500.00 towards SNAP. As donations come in from the community they go towards the care of our animals. BUT, if they are "marked" anywhere on the check, has a note or even a verbal request that they are for the SNAP program then that is where it goes. For example, we start with \$500 from Morning Starr. Then as spay and neuter applications come in we deduct that amount from the \$500. If we receive a donation for the SNAP then we add that amount. It looks something like this...

On Jan 1, 2011 we start with \$500.00. All Morning Starr funds. As other donations come in from you, that are directed to the SNAP fund, we add them directly to that total. So a donation of \$100 directed to SNAP means we now have \$600 for the month. If we get another donation, i.e. \$25 then we now have \$625 for this month toward the SNAP. As we pay for the spays and neuters, that amount is deducted from this amount until all the funds are used up for that month. If donations keep coming in and there are funds to keep offering assistance then we keep going! Then we start again the next month. Some people want their donation to go toward SNAP and also general care of the animals. That's fine too. Just put a note with the donation and state how much you would like to go for SNAP and how much for general use. We are always happy to honor any of your requests. Any donations that are received with no specific direction will automatically go towards the animals in our care. Clear as mud, right? GIVE ME SHELTER



It's Just A Walk In The Park!

Are you having some behavior problems with your dog? Would you be surprised if all it took to turn them around was a nice walk? Well it can! I am not talking about a walk where your dog is pulling you all over the place and doing their business all over the neighborhood. I am talking about having a nice controlled walk with your

dog at your side until you decide where they will do their stuff. When you come upon things that get your dog going into negative behavior just make him sit and turn his back to the situation and wait until he is completely relaxed, then you move on. It is important to get your dogs used to the everyday sounds and sights of life. People jogging by, garbage trucks, moving vehicles, other animals, children playing etc. If dogs are just left to a big backyard or acreage and never exposed to some of these situations they will not behave properly when they confront them. Stay relaxed and don't get upset with the dog if he does not know how to react the first time he experiences some of the strange things, people and noises. Be patient and just keep your cool. It is important to keep the leash relaxed and don't move on until it is loose. It may mean that you only get to the end of the driveway in the first walk, but until you can walk with a loose leash with you dog beside you, you should not continue. If you pull back on your dog it only makes them pull more and some dogs have very strong necks and it does not do anything. Pull only to the side for a correction. Make sure the leash is high on the neck like the show dogs have it. This will give you more control. Start when your dog is young and it will give you the perfect dog! Give it a try! It will give you and your dog a beautiful bonding experience!
