## SPAY NEUTER CLINIC MAKING PROGRESS!

We are proud to present to you the first picture of the future low cost spay/neuter clinic! We have lots of work to do in order to get the building ready but we are up to the challenge. Thanks to the wonderful support of the community our Board of Directors, our volunteers and many rescue

groups in the area, we are making progress. Donations of equipment and supplies from Adopt-for-Life Center, Jerome Humane Society, Habitat for Humanity and Sedona Paint Center have really helped to get us going! Monetary donations from the community in memory of loved ones and loved pets is also helping. We are thankful for all the help from Red Rose Inspiration for Animals and the "wish list" printed by The Flagstaff-Sedona Dog Magazine. Also for the ongoing help from Sedona Copy for printing our newsletters. Dewey's Plumbing have been a wonderful asset as well as guidance from Dr. Jerry Oler from Cornville Pet Clinic. We are still looking for an oxygen tank, an autoclave, spay packs and gently used vet equipment or funds to purchase these things. We encourage the community to support this much needed asset. ### OUR GRANT FROM THE ASPCA WAS GREAT!

Thanks to a very generous grant from the ASPCA we achieved 18 spays of female cats, 7 neuters of male Cats, spayed 20 female dogs and neutered 18 male dogs, so far. I have applied for more grants but they do take time but we are thinking positive and hope to offer more assistance very soon. That is why it is so important that we open the new low cost spay neuter clinic. If one day we have spayed and neutered enough of the dogs and cats in the area that the only way to get a dog is form a breeder, I will be very happy! My dream is that every dog and cat in a home is one that has given much thought about before getting. That families have only the dogs and cats that they can financially afford to take the very best of care. Is part of the family and very much wanted. Where people can pick a family pet without the pressure that if they don't give it a home, it may be euthanized. I will be ecstatic when I don't hear the words "I need to get rid of this dog/cat or these puppies or kittens"



ever again. When organizations like Humane Societies and Animal Control will be a resource to find a missing dog and that is it. I believe it can happen with our new low cost spay neuter clinic and continuing to apply for and receive grants to this end.
